What Is Currently Allowed?

From Hawaii and Guam

- Day-old chicks: Allowed
- Hatching eggs: Allowed
- Live adult poultry: Not allowed

From the Mainland United States

- Hatching eggs: Allowed
- Day-old chicks: Not allowed
- Live adult poultry: Not allowed

Hatching Egg Imports from Mainland U.S., Hawaii, and Guam: Requirements

DLNR continues to allow the importation of hatching eggs from Hawaii and the Mainland U.S. under the following conditions:

Inspection Certification (T85-20.1 § 85-20.1-825)

- ☐ Description of the hatching chicks
- ☐ Statement of pullorum-clean rating for the source flock
- ☐ Statement that the flock has been free of transmissible disease symptoms for 60 days
- ☐ Statement of vaccination for any disease

Sanitation Statement

Exporters must confirm the following:

- ☐ Thorough cleaning to remove organic debris
- ☐ Disinfection with EPA-approved avian influenza disinfectants
- ☐ Fumigation or fogging to eliminate surface contamination
- ☐ Adherence to biosecurity measures during handling and transport

Packaging: Hatching eggs must be packed in new, unused containers.



Day-Old Chick Imports from Guam and Hawaii: Requirements

A permit must be obtained from DLNR Animal Health prior to importing day-old chicks. Ranchers should reach out to Animal Health for an application and submit the following documents for review:

*Inspection Certification (in compliance with T85-20.1 § 85-20.1-825)

- ☐ Description of the day-old poultry
- ☐ Statement of pullorum-clean rating for the source flock
- ☐ Statement that the flock has been free of transmissible disease symptoms for 60 days
- ☐ Statement of vaccination for any disease

*Proof of NPIP Certification:

- ☐ Chicks come from NPIP-certified hatcheries that participate in avian influenza surveillance.

For All Imports

*Itinerary

- ☐ Attach a complete travel itinerary.
- ☐ Note: Layovers in foreign countries and/or the U.S. mainland are **not permitted**.

*Payment

- **On-Island:** Pay \$25 at the CNMI Treasury, Capitol Hill, and deposit into account DC005 (Animal Health).
- **Off-Island:** Pay \$25 via cashier's check or money order.
